Dane Bowen writes in the Way book- "I pointed out that four families of New England Puritan ancestors of the Ways---the Ways, Sumners, Mavericks, and Gyes--all came from England's West Country rather than from East Anglia where the majority of New England Puritans

originated. It is from East Anglia that one got the "Norfolk whing" and the current New England accent, from there one got the salt Box houses, and the distinctive settlement pattern of farmers living in villages of houses clustered together and going out to work on individual farms. Now, it turns out that we have a fifth family of New England Puritan ancestors from England's West Country, the Harris's.

In the West Country one lived out on the land, settlements were more scattered, society was quite different, being more hierarchical with nobility, cavaliers, and county squires. People drew out their vowels rather than swallowed them, giving the South of the United States its distinctive accent. The West Country people fried foods more than those of East Anglia, we were strong on boiling and baking.

Gloucestershire is famous for its cathedral town of Gloucester, connected to the sea by a canal. It is just above the head of the Bristol Channel that separates the south coast of Wales from southwest England where the Mavericks and Gyes came from. King John I, who granted the Magna Carta in 1215 A.D., "loved Gloucester more than England." Our Way ancestor, Henry III, was crowned there. The first cathedral in the Gothic Perpendicular Style was built there."

She married **AARON (II) WAY** October 01, 1674 in Salem, Essex County, Massachusetts, son of AARON WAY and JOANNA SUMNER. He was born October 06, 1650 in Salem, Essex County, Massachusetts Bapt., and died December 02, 1730 in Dorchester, Dorchester County, South Carolina.

### Notes for MARY MAVERICK:

On p. 64 of the Way book key words were inadvertently left out of the sentence four lines from the bottom which starts, "About 1633 Elias Maverick married...." To this day no one has corrected the mistake but I wish to at this time. The sentence should read, "About 1633 Elias Maverick married the daughter of the widow of Deacon William Stitson...."

In 1909 there was published, place unknown, "Harris Family From AD 1630, in Two Lines," by Dwight James Harris, M.D., and Norman Dwight Harris, Ph. D. The book opens on p. 3 as follows:

"Thomas Harris, with his wife Elizabeth and their children, came to these shores from England, and were residents of Charlestown in the colony of Massachusetts Bay, in 1630. The next year the former had charge of the ferry between Boston and Winnisimet, which latter place became incorporated as Chelsea January 10, 1738. After the death of her husband, the widow Harris became the wife of Deacon William Stetson [different spelling] of Charlestown, who in 1680, testified in court substantially to the above facts (See Wyman's Genealogical History of Charlestown Mass.)"

Deacon Stetson died April 11, 1691, without having any children of his own. His will dated April 12, 1688 identifies Anna Maverick as a child of his first wife by her former husband, Thomas Harris. When Elias Maverick, second son of the Rev. John Maverick, died about 1684, his will dated Oct. 19, 1681, provided for his wife, Anna nee Harris Maverick and others.

Mary Maverick, daughter of Elias Maverick and Anna nee Harris Maverick, married Aaron Way, Jr., and made all their descendants heirs not only to nobility but to royalty as well.

In the Way book I pointed out that four families of New England Puritan ancestors of the Ways---the Ways, Sumners, Mavericks, and Gyes---all came from England's West Country rather than from East Anglia where the majority of New England Puritans originated. It is from East Anglia that one got the "Norfolk whine" and the current New England accent, from there one got the salt box houses, and the distinctive settlement pattern of farmers living in villages of houses clustered together and going out to work on individual farms. Now, it turns out that we have a fifth family of New England Puritan ancestors from England's West Country, the Harris's.

In the West Country one lived out on the land, settlements were more scattered, society was quite different, being more hierarchical with nobility, cavaliers, and country squires. People drew out their vowels rather than swallowed them, giving the South of the Untied States its distinctive accent. The West Country people fried foods more than those of East Anglia, who were strong on boiling and baking.

Anna nee Harris Maverick was born abt. 1613 in Cheltenham, Gloucestershire, England, and died Sept. 7, 1697, at Reading, Middlesex, Mass, age 84. Her father, Thomas Williams alias Harris, was b. abt. 1580-90 at Cheltenham, Gloucestershire, England, d. 1632 at Charlestown, Suffolk Co., Mass, across the river from downtown Boston, married abt. 1612 in Gloucestershire Elizabeth Hills, b 1577 at or near Gloucester, England, d. Feb. 16, 1669/1670, Charlestown, Suffolk, Mass. age 92 (another very long-living ancestor).

Gloucestershire is famous for its cathedral town of Gloucester, connected to the sea by a canal. It is just above the head of the Bristol Channel that separates the south coast of Wales from southwest England where the Mavericks and Gyes came from. King John I, who granted the Magna Carta in 1215 A.D., "loved Gloucester more than England." Our Way ancestor, Henry III, was crowned there. The first cathedral in the Gothic Perpendicular Style was built there. Cheltenham is a few miles east of Gloucester.

At the time that Thomas Harris and his family came to America, the strong tendency was to perpetuate first names in the family. In the next generation a Thomas Harris built and installed the great organ in Glouscester cathedral. But Harris was a common name.

At the D.A.R. library in Washington, D.C. this weekend I found the book, The Way Family. I'm sorry

to say I did not write down the author or date of publication, but will next time I go. It begins with an introduction about Henry Way, the Puritan, then gives information on his immediate family.

Then, on page 261 it has the following: "Aaron, Jr. and his brother, William Way, were opposed to the belief in witches. Aaron, Jr. had been present at some of the trials and saw what went on in the court room. He was present at the examination of Martha Corey, who did not believe there were any witches, when the judge was questioning her, trying to get her to admit she was guilty of bewitching. Her answer was, "Would you have me belie myself?" Weary, probably of the protracted proceedings, her head dropped on one side; and forthwith the necks of the afflicted children were bent in the same way...Elizabeth Hubbard's neck was fixed in that direction, and could not be moved. Abigail Williams cried out, 'Set up Goody Nurse's head, the maid's neck will be broke.' Whereupon some persons held the prisoner's head up, and Aaron Way observed that Betty Hubbard's was immediately righted.

There was dissatisfaction in Salem Village with Rev Mr Samuel Parris, their pastor, who was blamed for his attitude and belief that some of his congregations were witches. The first pranks of the afflicted children had been at Mr Parris's house in February, 1692. William Way (Aaron Sr Henry) visited Rev Parris at the latter's house, as a witness to the injustices Rev Parris had

brought upon the community, and came away without satisfaction."

Then there are a couple of paragraphs about letters, and the group moving...and then this:

"It was Aaron Way, Jr. who was at the Salem witchcraft trials, and it was probably his little Sarah Way, born April 11, 1687 and died November 31,1689, whom Mrs Ann Putman referred to on the witness

stand, when she said, 'The apparition of John Willard told me that he was killed....and Aaron Way's child.'

I'm sorry to say there were numbered references following each paragraph, but I did not think to copy them. I will need to do this next time I go. If it would help you to have them I'd be happy to send you a copy. Just let me know. Marie
