

Newhall Register Report

We are descended from a full **eight** lines of Newhalls from the parents of the emigrants Thomas, Anthony & Elizabeth to my grandmother Marian Louise Newhall.. If we were able to chart it accurately, it would have a football shape. Also, the Newhall Family could credibly be called one of the more prolific in Lynn, Essex co., MA – hence the proliferation of favorable historical publicity in the 1800s. It is also an incredibly inbred family. Thus, the Newhall lines have been a lot of work, but research is far from complete and comprehensive. The lines are sound and Vital Records have been fairly thoroughly searched. However, I would love to get a full set of wills, deeds, legal records and other primary sources into the Newhall family research, then extrapolate upon the lives of these people from those documents. These will be added with lots of time.

The Newhalls have yet to appear in “The Great Migration” series. My guess is that solid, documented proof of the family’s existence in Lynn before 1635 to the scholarship standards of the research project have yet to be found. Family lore, of course, maintains that the three emigrant children and progenitors of the family line in Eastern Massachusetts came to Lynn, Essex co., MA in 1630. It is now known that Elizabeth came over with her husband Edmund Farrington in 1635 and that Anthony & his family probably came over at roughly the same time. Thomas was probably here earlier, but concrete proof is fuzzy. An infamous family “fact” is that Thomas’ son Thomas was “the first white child born in Lynn” in 1630. Anderson maintains that this is a nineteenth century fiction and, without solid proof, one cannot dispute that conclusion. Still, it was a nice feeling to discover Thomas (1630) and his tale and know that I had confirmed one of the few family statements my long-dead grandmother had averred when I knew her in the last stages of what is now known as Alzheimer’s Disease. Whether the tale is true or not, she was correct that we are descended from this man. We are also descended from his brother Anthony & sister Elizabeth. In short, we are related in some fashion to all the Newhalls of this branch of the family. While Newhall and Newell are often used interchangeably in the town records, there is a distinctly **different** family descended from Abraham Newell and one must be careful not to confuse the two! However, in doing research, I’ve found that one must search under the following name variations to find everyone’s records and sort them out correctly: Nehall, Neuhall, Newal, Newall, Newel, Newell, Newhal, Newhall, Newhaul, Newhill, Newill, Nuall, Nuhall, Nuhaul.

I’ve read 19th century tracts on the Newhalls which are written in prose as purple as a Harlequin romance novel. Sifting fact from fiction is thus a careful process with this family. The 19th century writers were big on extolling the virtues of the family members, but short on factual citations and full reproduction of primary sources like wills and deeds (The style of the time was to distill the “important” facts for the reader.) Even within written family notes and lore, I’ve found a yearning to prove an alliance with a prominent (usually “19th century prominent”) Lynn family or to prove the “upstanding” or important nature of a given person or line prevails over presenting an accurate account of the family. This is seen in the prevailing Newhall sources. This bias and the obsession the 19th century chroniclers had with “Thomas-as-first-white-child-born-in-Lynn” also meant that his brother Anthony ‘s family got extremely short shrift in research and publication and their other siblings are not mentioned at all! Working with early research on the Newhalls gives the impression that only Thomas and Anthony crossed the sea and that only Thomas’ descendants were “worth chronicling”.

The most accurate 19th century history of the family is the excellent Henry Waters account in the Essex Institute Historical Collections and later reprinted as a book in its own right.. It is well-written and well-cited. Charles Newhall’s “History of My Ancestry” is basically lifted verbatim and without attribution from Waters. James Newhall’s history of Lynn includes many interesting Newhall accounts – including one which literally reads as fairy tale and tells how the First Newhall Mother (a pure-blood Saxon, daughter of the devoted servant of the Lord of the Manor) and the First Newhall Father (a pure-blood Norman, and said Lord of the Manor) got together and gave birth to the First Newhall Son. It has no citations to show any basis in fact and comes across as pure, unmitigated 19th century fiction to the 21st century reader. In short, Newhall accounts tend to be more fanciful and less accurate than those written by scholars without the Newhall surname or close ties. I have learned a great deal about how to (and how NOT to) do genealogical research from having to do extensive research on this family.

And so, to the family research at hand...

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Newhall Coat of Arms: Azure, 3 plates or, on each an ermine spot sable Crest: a cross crosslet fetchée azure. Motto: Diligentia ditat.^[1]

Before the reformation, the family lived in Wiltshire, England, apparently as yeomen, since they had some estates at the time. "Virtually none" of these family estates were extant when Waters published his research in 1882. By the 1630s, the family was in the area of Olney, Buckinghamshire, England. Olney still exists as a small town smack in the middle of a triangle formed between Northampton, Bedford & Milton Keynes/Bletchley. Thus, the Newhalls were within a short distance of the areas of Kempston & Henlow where the Ivory family held lands.

Waters cites the following general info about the Newhall Family:

"...In GLEANINGS FROM ENGLISH RECORDS ABOUT NEW ENGLAND FAMILIES, published in Essex Historical Collections for the year 1880 (Parts I and II), may be found...abstracts of various Newhall, Newall and Newell wills examined in London, not one of which, however, seems to furnish any clew that will assist us in tracing the English origin of this family. The earliest reference to the name in the GLEANINGS was to one Thomas Newhall, whose will, written in latin in 1498 and proved 22 April 1499, mentions, among others, wife Emmota and a Thomas Newhall whom he appoints executors. He wishes his body to be buried in the chapel of Witton and makes bequests to the Abbot and Convent of the Blessed Mary of Vale Royal, and for the repairs of the church at Budworth. All these places are in Cheshire. The earliest mention of the name in printed history is to be found in Bloomfield's history of Norfolk, wherein we learn that a certain manor was bewtowed by one of the baronial proprietors upon one of his sons, who built a new hall, whence he obtained the name of Johannis de Nova Aula, alias John de Newehall. This indicates the probable origin of the surname, which may have thus arisen and become established...in various parts of England..."^[2]

Charles Newhall averred that Johannis de Nova Aula was in Wiltshire in the 11th century^[3]. He further quotes James R. Newhall: "...'Oliver Cromwell seems to have been the owner of a manor called Newhall; and indeed the writer remembers to have seen the names Cromwell and Newhall in some way connected far back in English history. But the Protector, finding the possession yielding but little, or perhaps being pushed for means, in 1656 expressed a desire to dispose of the estate.' He authorized his son to sell it for £18,000 but whether he realized that amount we know not. One or more of the Dukes of Buckingham once occupied a manor of Newhall about 1320..."^[3]

Charles Newhall cites the aforementioned will of Thomas Newhall (1498/1499) and further mentions that translation of the Latin indicates that Thomas had a brother named Hugo, daughters named Margaret and Elizabeth and "other females who may have been married daughters". Apparent sons named are Thomas (who received one cow and was named co-executor with his mother Emmota), William and Stephen^[4]. He further cites the will of Thomas Newell, proven 24 September 1529, which mentions a sister named Margaret as an example of the interchangeability of Newhall and Newell^[5].

Sans proof, I have chosen to start the family with the currently unnamed parents of Thomas, Anthony & Elizabeth Newhall. Further research on English Genealogical Gleanings will hopefully connect the Lynn Family with its English Origins.

2. **Elizabeth² NEWHALL (*not known*¹)** was born in 1586 in Olney, Buckinghamshire, England and died on 15d:10m:1658 in Lynn, Essex co., MA.

On 29 November 1613 when Elizabeth was 27, she married **Edmund FARRINGTON** (*see Farrington*), in Sherington, Buckinghamshire, England. He was a Farmer & owner of the "well known tidedmill in Lynn" [6].

Edmund, Elizabeth and their children Sarah, John, Elizabeth, Mathew & Martha (Thomas, Edward and Joseph stayed in England) emigrated from England to America on the *Hopewell*; sailing from England on 1 April 1635 and arriving in Boston, MA in June 1635.

3. **Thomas² NEWHALL (*not known*¹)** was born on 8 June 1600 in Fulham, England and died in Lynn, Essex

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co., MA on 25 May 1674; he was 73^[7,8,9]. He is Waters #1.

On 12 June 1618 when Thomas was 18, he married **Mary Jane PENDLETON/WOOD/WOODARD**, in England^[7,17,18,19,20,21,22,23,24,25,26,27,28,29,30,9,31] Mary Jane was born circa 1601 in England and died in Lynn, MA on 25 September 1665; she was 64^[7,9,11].

Family Lore has Thomas, Sr. and family emigrating to Salem, Essex co., MA in 1630. Proof of his migration is not yet found. In addition, Freeman evidence not found by Charles Newhall^[5]. Regardless, Thomas immediately moved to Lynn, Essex co., MA and was one of its first settlers. He was granted 30 acres in the 1638 land distribution. He was also part of the group which first settled Southampton, Long Island, NH.

Alonzo Lewis maintained that he "...lived on the wast side of Federal street, a few rods south of the mill brook, owning all the lands, on that side, between the Turnpike and Marion Street..." This was disproved by Waters^[16].

As to the extent of his education, Thomas only made "his mark" on his will. Charles Newhall (quoting James Newhall) maintains that Thomas knew how to write (although he had yet to find an actual signature) and made a mark only because of "infirmity, rather than ignorance".^[10]

Thomas' will was signed on 1 April 1668, proved on 30d:4m:1674^[11] and the estate administered on 25d:4m:1674.

"The last will and testament of Thomas Newhall Senior of Lyn in the county of Essex hauinge his prefect memory and understandinge iMprimis I bequeath my Spiritt to the Lord that gaue it and my Body to the dust from whence it was taken. I bequeath my twelf acres of salt marsh to my sonn Thomas Newhall and my sonn John Newhall, the six acres that my sonn Thomas shall haue is three Acres in Rumley marsh neere the Island, and the rest is a pcell lyinge in the Towne marsh caled Gaines his neck and another pcell lyinge in the Towne marsh adioyninge to my Brother ffarington and the six acres yt my sonn John shall haue lyeth in the last Deuission in Rumley marsh, but if my soon John should haue noe child before he dyeth then the six Acres I giue to my sonn John, to returne to my sonn Thomas & his heires for euer but if my sonn John should haue a child or childeren, then the sd six Acres to bee att his owne disporre foreuer. I bequeath to my sonn Thomas Brownes his children twenty Pounds equally to be deuided betweene them and the sixteene Pounds wch he hath alreedy of mine in his hands is to be pt of this Twenty pounds I giue to his childeren. I bequeath to my sonn Richard Hauen his childeren twenty pounds to be equally deuided amongst them, namly betweene Joseph Hauen, Richard Hauen, Sarah Hauen, Nathaniell Hauen & Moses Hauen this not to be pd vntill they com to the age of twenty one yeares, I bequeath to my tow daughters, Susana Hauen & Mary Browne each of them a paire of sheetes & each of them too pillow beares. Alsoe I constitute & make my lawfull & sole executor & to pforme this my last will & testament, my sonn Thomas Newhall. I doe alsoe bequeath to my sonn Thomas Newhall his childeren thirty pounds, and that this is my tru will & testament I haue sett to my hand this first of aprill, 1668:"

Waters says that the thirty acres referred to were the 30 acres he received in the 1638 Land Distribution^[14]. Interestingly, he does not mention his grandchildren Hannah, Mary, Susanna & John Haven in this will^[15].

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4. Francis² NEWHALL (*not known*¹) was buried on 24 January 1604/5.

5. Anne² NEWHALL (*not known*¹) was baptized on 8 January 1620/1 and on 18 Jan 1635/6 married Baldwin PARKER.

6. Mary² NEWHALL (*not known*¹) married Raphael ROSE on 15 October 1635.

7. Anthony² NEWHALL (*not known*¹) died in 31d:11m (January):1656/7 in Lynn, Essex co., MA^[7,32,33]. He is Waters #2. On 6 November 1632 Anthony married **Mary WHITE**, in Olney, Buckinghamshire England^[7,17,39,40,41,42,43,44]. Mary died before 14 January 1656.

Anthony was in Lynn by 1636^[33] and was granted 30 acres in the Lynn, Essex co., MA 1638 Land Distribution^[33]. His homestead was on the east side of Federal Street and went to Anthony's son John in Anthony's will. Waters pointedly corrects Alonzo Lewis, who states that this parcel abutting Federal Street belonged to Anthony's brother, Thomas Newhall. Waters states that this "can be shown very conclusively", but gives no sources^[38]. Supposedly, he lived in Salem for a time^[33].

Anthony's will was written on 14 January 1656 and proved on 31 March 1656/7^[34].

16. Susanna³ NEWHALL (*Thomas², not known¹*) was born circa 1624^[45] and died in Lynn, Essex co., MA on 7 February 1682; she was 58^[15]. She is Waters #3. Susanna married **Richard HAVEN** – who was born in “the West of England” ^[47] but was in Lynn, Essex co., MA ca. 1645^[47].

She gave the following deposition in 1661:^[46]

“The testimonye of Susanna Haven aged about thirtye seuen years sworne saith that the wife of Will. Longlye came to my housbands house (it was the weeke of boston county court last) : and I asked her what news at boston, she said John Hathorne was cast and the bulls were recouered from him and that the magistrats said they might charge him the said Hathorne with felony but sayed she, that which is worse then all this is; that John hathorne had put more into a writing then should be & that it was forgerye and that the magistrats did very much check him for it -- & further saith not. Sworne in Court at Salem...”

She was also deposed on 5 November 1678, where she states her age as being “about fifty six” ^[47].

Estate: Richard wrote his will on 21 May 1701, with John Burrill, Jr.; Joseph Burrill & Sarah Ballord as witnesses. The will was proved on 14 June 1703. Again, Waters gives the “highlights”: “...In it he mentions son John, son Nathaniell, grandson Joseph, son of son Richard Haven dec’d, son Moses, dau. Hannah Gooddell, son in law, John Tarbox, dau. Sarah Whitney, grandson Westol Cogswell, grand dau. Hannah Parker, gr. dau. Hannah Gooddell, son Moses Haven’s children, dau. Hannah’s children. The homestead, which he left to his son Moses, except that part of it where his daughter Hannah’s house stood, lay North of Mill Street and next East of the lot which William Longley sold to Thomas Browne in 1663. It embraces all those house lots lying West of the extension of Federal Street and running from Mill Street back to the Rocks or to the road leading to Fresh Marsh...” ^[48]

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They had the following children (*surnamed HAVEN*):

17. Thomas³ NEWHALL, Jr. (*Thomas², not known¹*) was born in 1630 or 1631-1632 in Lynn, Essex co., MA^[49,50,51,52]. Thomas died in 1687; he was 57^[49,53]. He was buried on 1 April 1687 in Old Burying Ground, Lynn, Essex co., MA; Lynn, Essex co., MA^[7,54]. At the age of 2, Thomas was supposedly baptized in Lynn, Essex co., MA on 8 June 1632^[55]. However, this account is now in dispute. Okay, let's deal with this "First White Child Born In Lynn" Thing. The commonly accepted legend as reported in Lewis' *History Of Lynn* says that Thomas Newhall, Jr. was the First White Child Born In Lynn and was born in 1630. Further related is the claim that Thomas was baptised by the Reverend Stephen Bachiler upon his arrival to the Lynn settlement in 1632. By way of refute, Waters says it best^{#58}; Thomas is "said to have been the first white child born in Lynn (1630), but according to his own depositions was born about 1631-1632..."^[56] Thomas could read and write^[53]. He is Waters #4.

He served in the local military -- known as Corporal Thomas Newhall in Nicholas Potters deed of 26 May May 1675 and Ensign Thomas Newhall at the time of his death^[64,66].

In addition to his duties as a husbandman and farmer, Thomas, Jr. was apparently the local malster. This is shown by ht etools and malt house left in his will and the account of the 50th anniversary of Lynn given by Charles Newhall, where Thomas makes a present of his finest cider. The maltser was a fairly important and skilled occupation in colonial New England. The English emigrants brought with them their inante (and justified) mistrust of common water supplies. Wells in England were more often brackish harbors of disease than reservoirs of sweet-tasting, healthy water. Thus, the colonists drank beer, cider and – when available in the summer – milk. Some goodwives would lay in a months' long supply of beer or cider in their homes. Others would brew "small beer" on a weekly or bi-weekly basis. While these women were skilled brewmistresses, malting was not a skill for the everywoman. Laurel Thatcher Ulrich describes it as "the process of sprouting and drying barley to increase its sugar content...wisely left to the village expert"^[308] Thus, Thomas' skills were not only in demand, but of great importance to the settlement – despite this omission in the histories of propriety-minded 19th century historians ;^) !

Thomas owned all the lands east of Federal Street, between the Turnpike and Marion Street (on the borders of what is now Lynnfield), according to Alonzo Lewis. However, Charles Newhall uses the evidence given in the various lawsuits involving Thomas to place his home near the center of town, near George Keser's tannery.

On 30 November 1679, he bought "threescore acres" from Ezekiel and Sarah Needham. This plot was "bounded easterly with the dividing line between Salem and Lynn, westerly by 'a certaine farme comonly caled Mr Humphries but now Major Rainsberry's farme,' and southerly by the commons; which land the said Needham purchased of Daniel King, Senior, of Lynn, deceased."^[67,68] Charles Newhall further postulates that Thomas, Sr. bought this land to portion off to his sons. Joseph received some of this parcel and Nathaniel appears to have come into possession of some of this land as well.

Of course, let us not forget the New England colonial method of laying out towns in Eastern Massachusetts.

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One's house was in the center of town, near the Common and Meeting house. One's farmland, etc. was on the outskirts of the town center. Therefore, both suppositions could be correct.

Charles Newhall also tells this tale of Thomas Newhall's position within the town of Lynn: "...In 1679, the fiftieth anniversary of the settlement of Lynn was celebrated in royal style. The banquet took place at the 'Anchor Tavern', and was attended by all the notables within quite a radius. Judge Newhall says in 'Lin: Her Jewels': 'At the end of the table where were seated the chief dignitaries of the settlement, was Thomas Newhall, a man of respectability, though perhaps remarkable only as being the first white person born on the soil of the Third Plantation, and as the owner of the mill which expressed the best cider in the whole region. He was the father of ten children, eight or nine of whom were living at the time of this celebration. They, in their turn, became fathers and mothers, the race increasing till, at the time of the celebration of the two hundred and fiftieth anniversary it was almost beyond numbering. Much deference was paid to him for the interest he took in all public affairs, and for his private virtues. He had brought as a present to Mr. Turner [the landlord] a can of his very best cider..." [69]

In good English tradition, Thomas and his neighbors often settled their disputes before the court. Thomas' deposition of 1683:

"Thomas Newhall aged about fifty yeares testifyeth & saith that there was granted and laid out unto my Unkle Anthony Newhall and my Father Thomas Newhall two Lotts of thirty acres apeice [sic], according to ye Record of the Town of Lynne which were undivided, and I ever understood by Record & Comon account that Edward Burcham sometime an Inhabitant of Lynne had a Lott adjoining to the said Lotts on the east, and further testifyeth yt the said Lotts are now lying in the Township of Redding...10 November 1683." [57]

Thomas was further tried in March 1663 before the Quarterly Court for battery against the wife of William Longley^[58]. Elizabeth [Leighton] Newhall (wife of John Newhall) gave a deposition in the matter of this case of battery against the wife of William Longley:

"The testimony of Elizabeth Newhall ye wife of John Senier and Mary Haven who sayth yt Thomas Newhall Junior was desiered for to howld a poole [pole] for to rone a line between Will Longley and John Newhalls: then came ye two dafters of ye sayd Longley; namely Mary Longley & Anna Longley and threue stons at ye dayd Thomas Newhall; afterward ye sayd Anna toke up a peace of a pulle and stroke ye sayd Newhall severall blows with it, & presently after ye wife of ye sayd Longley came with a broad axe in hir hand and cam to ye sayd Newhall and violently stroke at ye sayd Newhall with ye sayd axe, but ye sayd Newhall sliped aside & soe ye sayd axe mised him: orwise wee can not but thinke but yt hee had bine much woulded if not killed: then presently after ye wife of Will Longley layd howld upone ye poole with hir dafters to pull ye poole away from ye sayd Newhall: but ye sayd Newhall pulled ye poole from ym. All this time ye sayd Newhall did stand upon ye land of John Newhalls. Taken upon oath 28d:1m:1653" [59]

Mary Longley gave the following deposition in this case:

"...that she, with her mother and sister Anna, was 'striuing to get a poole from Thomas Newhall Junior, taht he was holding up as I conceiue to runne a line, he heuing hold on one end we on the other and the said Newhall being on one side of our orchard fence and wee three on the other side of the said fence within our orchard; we had almost pulled the poole out of his hands but his brother John came and helped him and pulled it from us, and after the said Newhall had got the poole againe he strucke my mother seuerall blows with the poole so that one of her hands was black and blue severall days after.'..." [60]

In addition, litigation was brought in the matter of the death of Thomas' daughter, Elizabeth¹, who drowned in a pit dug by a neighbor:

"The testimony of the wife of Robert Potter and the wife of John Newhall: Testifieth and saith we seinge the wife of Thomas Newhall Juner in a graite fright for her Child we went to hellpe her look for her Child and we founde it drouded in a pett of watter a littell below the house of Thomas Newhall Juner."

"We Robert Potter and John Newhall: understandin by Too Testimonies. That Thomas Newhalls child was drouded in a pett which pett we heard George Kesar saye he digged: farther we doe Testifie that George

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Keser had a Tanfatt in that pett. I John Newhall doe furder Testifie that George Keser did take up his fatt and left the pett open. Sworn in Court 29d:9m:1665" [61]

"The deposition of Thomas Morris aged therten or fortenn years yestifyeth that when goodman Newels childe was drownde, & he saide in that holl that we rakede out the furtt & put watter in to keep alwifes to go a fishing & he went downe & showed me the holl & I have sen durt pulled out of that holl: & I have senn John Newell: & Thomas Newell & Joseph Newell put watter and fish into that holl as they say the childe was drownd in & further sayth nott." [54]

The jury report came back:

"Wee under written being warned by Thomas Wheeler Constable of Lynn to enquire of the death of a child of Tho: Newell Junyr Upon ye 13th of this prsent month meeting at ye dwelling house of ye aforesd Newell wee saw there a dead child, which we were informed was drowned in a pitt of water which pitt or hole of water we were at, where did appeere to us two woemen: ye wife of Robert Potter & ye wife of John Newall, yt did say to us, yt in yt pitt they found ye said child swimming or floating upon top of ye water and tooke up ye sd child, being dead when they found it, we alsoe asked ye mother of ye sd child how long shee mist the child, whoe said to us, it was betweene half a houwer & an hower & yt ye sd child went from he well ye last yt she saw it living, & upon further inquirye we find noe other cause of ye death of ye said child, being about two yeares of age, but ye said pitt being neere two foot deepe of water & mudd, being neere to ye highway before ye doore of ye said Newall & the said pitt being six or seuen foot ouer & being faling ground, neere to ye said pitt a child playing neere aboute there, any small slip or stumble of a child would ocasion his fale into ye aforesaid pitt." [54,62]

Inventory of his estate was taken on 8 April 1687 by John Fuller, Sr.; Ralph King & John Burrill and presented to the Court on 14 April 1687 by John Newhall, one of the executors. It is recorded in Suffolk(!) co., but no evidence of will or inventory is in Court files^[63].

The estate was appraised at £700. It included "...a long table and two forms, a cupboard, cupboard cloth and cushion and galss case, a table, six joined stools with a carpet anda joined chair and cushion. There were found five guns for fowling and training, at four pounds, two swords at twenty shillings and books at twelve shillings. Of live stock he had a mare and a colt, two horses, thirty-eight sheep and fourteen lambs, four oxen (two at Josephs), six cows, besides numerous calves, yearlings, two-year-olds, four-year-olds and swine. In the inventory of real estate we find 'The Dwelling house and mault house & mault mill and house over it with all appurtenances belonging to the mault house and other privedges with the Conveniences to the well, as also a six acre Lott adjoining to the Dwelling house, and an orchard, appertaineing and an old Barne with all priveledges £170. 0s. 0d.; 18 acres adj. the house of John Newhall; Blood's neck marsh (7-1/4 acres); 3 acres of marsh at Burch Islands; 3 acres at E. side of Great Island in Rumney Marsh; 6-1/2 acres in Battie's lot; 2 acres in Ramsdell's neck; 1-1/2 acre in Town marsh; 7 acres at Fox Hill; 30 acres in Reading; two ten-acre lots; 30 acres possessed by Nathl Newhall in the country; and a six-acre lot, only some part taken off that fronts upon the highway..." [64,65]

In 29d:10m (December):1652 when Thomas was 22, he married **Elizabeth POTTER**, daughter of Nicholas POTTER & Emma KNIGHT, in Lynn, Essex co., MA.^[49,7,17,70,22,71,72,73,74] She was born circa 1632 in Lynn, MA. Buried on 22 Feb 1686/1687 in Old Burying Ground, Lynn, Essex co., MA^[7]. Some sources have speculated that Elizabeth could possible be the daughter of Robert Potter instead of Nicholas, but this is doubtful.

18. **Mary³ NEWHALL** (*Thomas², not known¹*) was born in 1637 in Lynn, Essex co., MA^[75] and died after 21 April 1701; she was 64^[76,77]. She is Waters #6. Mary married **Thomas BROWN**, son of Nicholas BROWN. Thomas was born circa 1628^[78,83] and died on 28 August 1693; he was 65^[82]. Thomas may have had a previous wife, "but Mary was undoubtedly the mother of all his children from and after 1658, when her name, as his wife, first appears on the records..."^[76]

"The deposition of Mary Browne aged about thirty one years whoe testifieth and saith, That her cousin John Haucks being at my brother John Newhal his house whoe was ye constable; at a tyme when shee this deponant was there & did heare ye said Jahn Hawckes say; ytDaniell Hutchens said that hee would dliuer up all the cattle yt ye constable had attached, and then this deponany opposed yt saying and asked hom whether hee did not say yt hee would deliuer up all his right yt hee had in them, then John Hawckes said, yea hee did speake such words: & further saith not. Sworne in Court at Salem 1d:5m:1668. Attestes Hillyard Veren Clerics."^[78,79]

"The testimony of Mary Browne aged about fower & tewenty years of age sworne saith that spaking with the wife of William Longlye about John Hathorne, attached a cow or soe; it had not bin much, but to attach all that they had, it was more then he need to haue don: I sayd to her, I suppose he esteemes his name more then all your estate, shee sd againe to me, his name; is his name so good, or what is his name worth, has he redeemed his name spaking in a slite derideing waye (to my understanding) and spaking further to mee about that which Andrew Mansfeild had said against the sd Hathorne, sayes she what was that; a great peece of busienes; of his mane and reputation & further saith not-- ye aboue written is sworne to in Court at Salem ye 25d:4m:1661 as atestes Hilliard Veren Clerics."^[80,81]

Mary was appointed administratrix of her husband's estate on 9 October 1693, with John Newhall, Sr. (brother) and Ebenezer Browne (son) as surities on the bond of administration^[82]. Thomas Browne, Sr.'s non cupative will was written down from oral testimony of witnesses on 9 October 1693. It read: "Memorandum: about two years since though in ye last sickness of Thomas Browne thereafter named he declared ye following sentences as his last will & testament who dyed about 6 weeks agoe^[82]." Waters says that this will is not on record, but remains on file in the office of the Register of Probate in Salem, Essex co., MA^[82].

The will "mentions his wife, his eldest son Thomas, sons Joseph, John, Daniel and Ebenezer, and daughter Norwood, and constitutes his 'brother John Newhall' and Robert Potter, Senr, overseers. The witnesses to this will were Jeremiah and Mary Shepard, and John Newhall, Senr. The widow rendered an account of administration" on 26 August 1695, when distribution was made to the children. Daughter Norwood is actually Mary, who married Thomas Norwood^[84].

Residences: "of Grawton Middlesex" co., MA in June of 1663. At that time he bought his homestead in Lynn, Essex co., MA from William Longley. This was six acres of land "bounded E. with land of Richd Haven, W. with land of John Newhall, S. on Mill Street and N. on the common." Note the abuttal between William Longley's land and John Newhall's land...it was the fence which played a part in the lawsuit between the Longleys and Thomas Newhall^[76].

19. Francis³ NEWHALL (*Thomas², not known¹*) was baptized on 24 October 1619.

20. John³ NEWHALL (*Thomas², not known¹*) was born in England^[16] and died before 7 April 1718^[85]. He is Waters #5. He was called "John Newhall, Sr." and his cousin John (Anthony's son) was called "John Newhall, Jr." or "John, son of Anthony Newhall". Upon this John's death, his cousin was called "John Newhall, Sr.". See this other John's entry (*below*) for further explanation of this practice.

John was granted administration at large of his son Joseph's estate on 4 February 1711/12. He signed the bond as "John Newhall Se."^[86]

John also served in the King Philip's war^[69].

On 3d:12m (February):1657 John first married **Elizabeth LAIGHTON**^[87], daughter of Thomas LAIGHTON, in Lynn, Essex co., MA^[58,66,7,88,19,89,18,90,17,91]. Elizabeth died on 22d:8m (October):1677 in Lynn, Essex co., MA^[7,58,66].

Elizabeth gave a deposition in the matter of Thomas Newhall's case of battery against the wife of William Longley:

"The testimony of Elizabeth Newhall ye wife of John Senier and Mary Haven who sayth yt Thomas Newhall Junior was desiered for to howld a poole [pole] for to rone a line between Will Longley and John Newhalls: then came ye two dafters of ye sayd Longley; namely Mary Longley & Anna Longley and threue stons at ye dayd Thomas Newhall; afterward ye sayd Anna toke up a peace of a pulle and stroke ye sayd Newhall severall blows with it, & presently after ye wife of ye sayd Longley came with a broad axe in hir hand and cam to ye sayd Newhall and violently stroke at ye sayd Newhall with ye sayd axe, but ye sayd Newhall sliped aside & soe ye sayd axe mised him: orwise wee can not but thinke but yt hee had bine much woulded if not killed: then presently after ye wife of Will Longley layd howld upone ye poole with hir dafters to pull ye poole away from ye sayd Newhall: but ye sayd Newhall pulled ye poole from ym. On 17 July 1679 John second married **Sarah FLANDERS**^[87], daughter of Stephen FLANDERS, in Lynn, Essex co., MA.^[58,7,19,92,24,93,17,18,88] She was born in 1654^[7].

21. John³ NEWHALL, Jr./Sr.^[94] (*Anthony², not known¹*) was born ca 1634/1635 [estimated from death info]^[49]. John died in Lynn, Essex co., MA on 6 Jan 1725/6; he was 91^[95,96]. John was a carpenter^[96]. He is Waters #8.

The Newhall system for naming is borne out in John. His name was "John Newhall, Jr." or "John, the son of Anthony Newhall" while his cousin John (Thomas Newhall's son) was living. Once his cousin died, John's appellation was "promoted" to "John Newhall, Sr."^[97]

John's birthdate is estimated from his gravestone -- where his age at death was given as 92 years on 6 January 1726. He also identifies himself as being aged "47 years or thereabout" in a deposition of 8 October 1683. In this deposition, he "Testifieth and saith that about eighteene or nineteene yeares agoe the said Deponent sold to John Peirson Senr of Redding thirty acres of undivided Land Lyeing on a neck of land in sd Redding against Pooles Mill (wch Neck of Land is said to be called pritchetts playne) being ye one half part of yt threescore acres of undivided Land wch was given to his ffather and Uncle. The wood and Timber thereon being cutt of and ye Land thereby Impoverished was the occasion of the sd Deponts selling sd Land."^[98]

John served in the military and was an Ensign by 1696^[97].

Residences: "In 1677 he bought of Samuel Frayle two and three-fourths acres 'at the head of Newhall's Lane, a little way from ye Graves, bounded with the Towne Common Southwardly, Mathew Farringtons Eastwardly ye Land of the said John Newhalls Northerly and ye Land Westerly.' This gave him a frontage along the whole easterly side of Federal street from Lynn common to Boston street."^[99]

On 10 January 1725, he entered a deed to his son, John, made 5 June 1705. "In this he is styled John Newhall, Junr, carpenter, and he gives to his son a dwelling house, where he [the son] now lives, with the land it stands upon and half the barn near said house, also one-half of the upland 'where I now live,' also one-half of the four acre lot in the Millstreet Field, etc., etc...."^[100]

According to Waters, "His estate does not appear in probate, but on the 27th of March 1720, he also made a deed of gift to his grandson John Newhall, of Lynn, weaver, he 'haveing lived long with me and done much for me in my age & weakness and in consideration that my sd Grandson pay to my Children & other Grandchildren the severall Legacies or Gifts as hereafter sett forth viz: To my son Nathaniel Newhall Twelve pounds' &c...'to Timothy Breed & Joseph Breed each of them Ten shillings to be paid within one year after my decease having given considerable to their mother in her life time. To Sarah Norwood ten shillings to Elizabeth Trevitt who hath lived long with me five pounds to be paid within one month after my decease having given considerable to their mother in her life time, to my Two daughters namely Rebecca Collins & Mary Newhall all by indoor moaveables to be equally devided betwixt them & that if my Grandson Henry Newhall shall see cause to dwell in Lynn He to have sixty poles of Land sett out by said John Newhall att ye Notherly head end of my homestead to build an House on for his own improvement for an habitation provided he so build within three years after my decease' etc., etc. In consideration of the above he conveys to his grandson John all the rest of the estate, both real and personal. In this deed he is called John Newhall, Senr, carpenter..."^[69]

On 31d:10m (December):1656/7 when John was 22, he married **Elizabeth NORMANTON**, in Lynn, Essex co., MA.^[49,7,101,102,42,33] Elizabeth died on 5 October 1712 in Lynn, Essex co., MA^[49,96].

According to Waters, her paretns are unknown; although he speculates that she may have been related to Abraham Normanton. Abraham was the schoolmaster in Lynn, Essex co., MA from 1695-1702. In the town

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records for 8 January 1695/6 is the following entry: "The selectmen did agree with Mr. Normanton to be scoolemaster for ye Town for ye year ensewing and the Town to giue him fiue pounds for his Labour & ye Town is to pay twenty fiue shillings towards teh hire of Nathniell Newhalls house for one year to keep scoole in & ye ad Mr Normanton to hire ye sd house." [97]

22. Mary³ NEWHALL (*Anthony², not known¹*) is Waters #7. She married **Richard HOOD**.

On 7 July 1682, Richard & Mary deeded over to Matthew Farrington, Jr. "...a dwelling house and all that parcell of land sometime in the possession of Anthony Newhall deceased, voz., four acres more or less, or two-thirds of a six acre lot where the house stood, bounded Westerly with land of John Gillow, Easterly with land of John Hawthorne, Northerly with land of Robert Potter, Senr, Southerly with the country highway that lyeth in the mill street..." This four acre lot was bequeathed to Mary in her father, Anthony's will^[103].

"The deposhion of Georg Kezer that saith that littell before Mr Geforde went away from the lorn worckes that I went to Richard hode diueres times to gett the saide Richarde hode to doe som saueing worcke for me & I couelld not gett hime to hellpe me by noe menes and I asked hime what ones the placke was for and he sayd thay was to doe something about the forge worckes and funder that I saw Richard hod sometimes a sauing of slitt worcke and some times cellowe bordes -- and the place were Richard hode saued was in the pitt before [the] lorn Workes ware houese neare to the Smith Shope and funder I say not. Sworne in Court 27d:4m:1656" [104]

Estate: Richard died intestate. Administration on his estate was granted to his son Richard on 9 December 1695. Richard died before this administration was finished and administration was then granted to Richard, Sr.'s son John on 7 September 1696. The estate was divided (account of trust rendered) on 14 December 1696. "...The children of the eldest son, he being dec'd,' two shares, and John, Samuel, Nathaniel, Joseph, Benjamin, Mary, Sarah, Elizabeth, Ruth, Rebeckah, Hannah and Anna Hood each one share..." [105]

Residences: Supposedly, Richard is from Lynn Regis, Norfolk, England^[104]. "In B.I.P. 58, Registry of Deeds for Essex County, Mass., appears record of conveyance by John Hood of Lynn for 30£ to Wm. Crofts of 'three dwelling howses or tenements wth all thereto belonging in Halsted in the County of Essex in old England wth a covenant for further assurance, And the said Willm is to pay 40s a peice to the sisters of the said John according to his father's will the wch areth in the bargain and sale by deed dated the 10th day of December 1652.'" [104]

Waters maintains that they built their homestead on the larger parcel of land left to them by Mary's father Anthony (and later sold to Mathew Farrington, Jr.) instead of the smaller lot north of the brook which Anthony stipulated in his will that they were to build^[106].

On 9 November 1674 when Thomas was 21, he married **Rebecca GREENE**, daughter of Thomas GREENE & Rebecca HILLS (-bef 4d:1m (March):1674/5), in Malden or Charlestown.^[109,7,110,111,19,112,113,114] She was born in 1654.^[109]

42. John⁴ NEWHALL, 3rd (Thomas³⁻², not known¹) was born on 14d:12m (February):1655/6 in Lynn, Essex co., MA.^[115,49] and died in Lynn, Essex co., MA on 20 Jan or June 1738; he was 82^[108,85]. He is Waters #22 and was a Bricklayer or Mason^[85].

This John was known as "John, Newhall, Tertius". However, by 7 April 1718, his uncle John (son of Thomas) had died. This meant that his uncle John (son of Anthony) moved up to be "John Newhall, Sr." and this John became "John Newhall, Jr." On that date, he gave a deposition calling himself "John Newhall, Jr." and gave his age as 62^[85].

Estate: "His estate does not appear in Probate; but he seems to have conveyed his Real Estate to his only son Jacob" on 24 December 1734 by deed or gift^[116]. "This deed describes various parcels, the first of which he calls 'my homestead where I lately dwelt with the dwelling house & all the other buildings standing thereon and said Homestead contains about twenty acres,' etc., bounded northerly and northwesterly on the country road, southwesterly and southerly on the Great Bridge River in part and partly on the marsh of Thomas Witt, sutheasterly and easterly partly on the marsh of Brook, so called. The witnesses to this deed were Richard

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Johnson, Solomon Newhall and Samuel Johnson..." [117]

Residences: John's home was "next to the Great Bridge" and deeded to his son Jacob in 1734^[67,118].

On 18 June 1677 when John was 22, he married **Esther BARTRAM**, daughter of William BARTRAM & Sarah [surname not known], in Lynn, Essex co., MA.^[108,85,7,119,108,120,19,115] She was born on 3 April 1658 in Lynn, Essex co., MA^[49,85]. Esther died on 28 September 1728; she was 70^[85].

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43. Ensign Joseph⁴ NEWHALL (Thomas³⁻², not known¹) was born^[121] on 22 September 1658 in Lynn, Essex co., MA^[108,122]. Joseph died on the road between Boston & Lynn on 29-30 January 1705/6; he was 46^[49,108]. He is Waters #23. As seen by his title, Ensign Joseph served in the militia and was also listed frequently in the Town Records "as holding some position of honor or trust."^[122] He was a member of the Massachusetts General Court, which led to his death. On 29 January 1705/6, he attended the session of the Massachusetts General Court (the colonial version of the State Senate or House of Representatives). That night, as he was riding home to Lynn from Boston, he was caught in a snowstorm and froze to death.

Joseph came into possession of some of the "threescore acres" bought by his father Thomas on 30 November 1679 from Ezekiel and Sarah Needham. This plot was "bounded easterly with the dividing line between Salem and Lynn, westerly by 'a certaine farme comonly caled Mr Humphries but now Major Rainsberry's farme,' and southerly by the commons; which land the said Needham purchased of Daniel King, Senior, of Lynn, deceased."^[67,118]

At the time of his death, he owned a 34-acre farm in north Lynn on the Salem (now Peabody) line. It was his share of the above deed. "In addition he had the Pond farm, so called, of one hundred and seventy acres lying north-westerly from his homestead and on the southerly side of Humphrey's pond, in the present town of Lynnfield. This was a portion of Col. John Humphrey's grant, afterwards owned by Richard Hancock and purchased by Joseph Newhall..."^[124]

Estate: Administration on his estate was granted on 10 July 1706. His wife renounced administration, so it was granted to sons Thomas and Joseph. Distribution of the estate was made on 17 July 1706 amongst the widow and all the children^[123].

Circa 1678 when Joseph was 19, he married **Susanna FARRAR**, daughter of Thomas FARRAR (1614/1615-23 February 1694) & Elizabeth [SURNAME NOT KNOWN] (-8 January 1680), in Lynn, Essex co., MA.^[7,22,125,126,90,127,108,128,129,108,122] She was born in 26d:1m (March):1659 in Lynn, Essex co., MA^[49,122].

Susanna received "one cowe" in her father's will^[122]. After she remarried, on 2 February 1733, "...Susannah Symonds of Lynn, widow, in presence of Richard Hood and Benj. Newhall, conveyed to her son Samuel Newhall, by deed of gift, all her right in the real estate which had been in the possession of her brother Thomas Farrar, late of Lynn, deceased, and was given unto him, the sd Thos. Farrar, by her hond father Mr. Thos. Farrar, formerly of Lynn, deceased..."^[123]

Nathaniel⁴ NEWHALL (Thomas³⁻², not known¹) was born on 17 March 1660 in Lynn, Essex co., MA^[108,130] and died on 24 December 1695; he was 35^[108,130]. According to Waters, Nathaniel lived “an uneventful life as a farmer”^[130]. He is Waters #24.

There was “...a deed of conveyance to Batholmew Gedney, Esq. of Salem, from the brothers Joseph and Nathaniel Newhall ‘joynt tenants on a certain farm’ in Lynn bounded ‘East Northerly with ye line that parts Salem and Lynn being ye bounds of Clarke’s farme so called and extending Northwestward and Southwestward until it comes to ye bounds of Humphryes farm so called.’...” The deed was dated 8 January 1696/7, but was put on record in 1719. The deed was acknowledged on 9 January 1696/7 at Salem when Joseph Newhall claimed that he had seen his brother Nathaniel sign^[131].

The only problem with this is that Nathaniel was long dead by this time. In fact, the intention of marriage for his widow’s second marriage was published on that date.

Fraud? Mis-entry? Hmm...

Nathaniel left “...besides his homestead, a parcell of land also ‘bought of the Pond farme’ and some ‘housinge and land and saltmarsh at Linn.’...”^[130] Although, “by the [account of administration] brought into court 11 July 1704 by Mrs. Elizabeth Ingersoll, widow and [administratrix] of Nathaniel Newhall, it appears that this portion of the Pond farm had only been bargained for, not bought...”^[130]

Administration was granted to Nathaniel’s widow, Elizabeth on 20 July 1696. She had moved to Topsfield, Essex co., MA by this time. Her surities were Samuel Simonds of Topsfield and Edward Norice of Salem^[132].

“The Real Estate, less widow’s dower, was settled on the eldest son Nathaniel, he giving bonds 23 Dec., 1706, to pay to the other children, Samuel, Jonathon and Elizabeth their portions. One of his sureties was his step-father John Ingersoll of Lynn. After the death of the widow the oldest surviving son, Samuel Newhall, joyner, was appointed administrator de bonis non on his father’s estate, 13 May, 1739 (Elisha Newhall and Ebenr Bancroft sureties), and the dower property was assigned to him 4 June 1739, he paying to the representatives of his brother Nathaniel, deceased, to his brother Jonathoan (of Lynn) and to his brother Isaac Stone of Lexington, in right of Elizabeth, his wife, their respective portions...”^[133]

Residences: Nathaniel also came into possession of some of the “threescore acres” bought by his father Thomas on 30 November 1679 from Ezekiel and Sarah Needham. This plot was “bounded easterly with the dividing line between Salem and Lynn, westerly by ‘a certaine farme comonly caled Mr Humphries but now Major Rainsberry’s farme,’ and southerly by the commons; which land the said Needham purchased of Daniel King, Senior, of Lynn, deceased.”^[67,118]

He lived in north Lynn, near his brother Joseph^[130].

In by 1685 when Nathaniel was 24, he married **Elizabeth SYMONDS**, daughter of Samuel SYMONDS & Elizabeth ANDREWS, in Lynn, Essex co., MA.^[7,134,19] Born on 12 August 1663 in Salem, Essex co., MA^[132].

45. Elizabeth¹ NEWHALL (Thomas³⁻², not known¹) was born on 21 March 1662 in Lynn, Essex co., MA^[108]. Elizabeth1 died in Lynn, Essex co., MA circa 1665; she was 2^[108]. She is Waters #25. Elizabeth1 is the child who drowned in the pit which George Kesar had originally dug for his tanning process. The

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Newhalls brought suit against him in the death of their daughter, but it was determined that Elizabeth's older brothers had dug out the pit to keep alewives and, thus, Kesar was not responsible for the child's death.

46. Elisha⁴ NEWHALL (Thomas³⁻², not known¹) was born on 3 November 1665 in Lynn, Essex co., MA and buried on 28 Feb 1686/7 in Lynn, Essex co., MA^[108]. He is Waters #26.

47. Elizabeth⁴ NEWHALL (Thomas³⁻², not known¹) was born on 22 October 1667 in Lynn, Essex co., MA^[108]. She is Waters #27.

48. Mary⁴ NEWHALL (Thomas³⁻², not known¹) was born on 18 February 1669 in Lynn, Essex co., MA^[108]. She is Waters #28.

49. Samuel⁴ NEWHALL (Thomas³⁻², not known¹) was born on 19 January 1672 in Lynn, Essex co., MA^[7,108,135,136,137 138]. Samuel died in Lynn, Essex co., MA by 6 April 1719; he was 47^[49,139]. Samuel was a Joiner^[138] and is Waters #29.

On 31 December 1695 when Samuel was 23, he married **Abigail LINDSEY**, daughter of Eleazer LINDSEY & Sara ALLEY in Lynn, Essex co., MA^[49,7,142,19,143,144,138] Torrey notes that an Intention was filed for Samuel Newhall and Mary Hallewell on 25 August 1685 in Lynn, Essex co., MA; but they probably didn't marry.

At Samuel's death, he was "...possessed of a homestead consisting of a dwelling house, two barns, one mal house and about twelve acres, bounded easterly with the land formerly of John Newhall, Sr., deceased, westerly with the land of Benjamin Potter, northerly with the common and southerly with the country road or highway." This is probably his father's homestead (see Thomas' estate inventory) as well as part of his grandfather Thomas Newhall's farm.^[140,141]

Estate: Samuel's estate was administered 2 January 1718 and divested/probated on 6 April 1719 amongst the widow and all the children^[139]. Administration was granted to his widow Abigail. Her sureties were James Houlton and Samuel King^[138]. Samuel, Jr. received the Real Estate and he gave bonds to pay his siblings their shares. He mortgaged the homestead to protect the sureties on these bonds to Samuel Stone, of Salem, bricklayer and Joseph Jacobs of Lynn, yeoman.

68. Joseph⁴ NEWHALL (John³, Thomas³, not known¹) was born on 18 December 1682^[82] and died before 4 Feb 1711/12; he was 28^[82]. He is Waters #33. Joseph married **Sarah [surname not known]**. His will was administered 4 February 1711/12, with his father, John as administrator^[66]. Joseph Jacobs and Nathaniel Hathorne were sureties. Inventory was presented 7 February 1712^[82]. A charge "To Sarah Newhall for mourning £9" was in Joseph's will^[82].

70. Elizabeth⁴ NEWHALL (John³, Thomas³, not known¹) was born on 28 May 1687^[82] and died on 12 April 1689; she was 1^[82]. She is Waters #35.

71. Sarah⁴ NEWHALL (John³, Thomas³, not known¹) was born on 6 September 1690^[82]. She is Waters #36.

72. John²⁴ NEWHALL (John³, Thomas³, not known¹) was born on 28 January 1692^[147]. He was Mariner^[6] and is Waters #37. This John was "John, the fifth" of the six extant John Newhalls from 1714 to 1717. by 1725, he had "moved up" to John Newhall, Jr. with the death of his father and uncles^[6]. John's will was signed on 11 May 1767 and proved on 3 November 1778. He appointed "his only surviving son John Newhall cordwainer sole executor^[148]. On 23 May 1726, John and his wife conveyed to "John Wells (his brother-in-law) a lot of salt marsh at the far end of Rumney Marsh, formerly possessed by his hond father John Newhall, Senr., deceased, butting north on Bennet's Creek and south on College River: witnesses Elizth Townsend and Ebenezer Townsend, jr." On 8 June 1747, "he conveys to Ebenezer Tarbox a part of a lot laid out to John Newhall, Senr; and his (2nd) wife Elizabeth releases dower."^[149] On 1 November 1722 when John² was 30, he first married **Abigail BAKER**, daughter of Thomas BAKER^[6].

John was known as "John Newhall Quartus" until his father's cousin John died. His father deeded it to him in 1705^[153].

John's will was written 5 April 1718 and proven 17 July 1718^[154,155]. According to Waters, "He mentions wife Rebecca and a 'Legesy of about Twenty pounds giuen by dr. Hond father Henery Collings yet in reuertion.' He leaves all his real estate to his "Eldist Sonn John Newhall, hoo hath liued long with mee and don much for mee,' and ten pounds apiece to sons Henry, Eleazer, Nathaniel and David Newhall and to daughter Sarah..."^[153]

On 28 March 1691 when John was 26, he married **Rebecca COLLINS**, daughter of Henry COLLINS Jr. & Mary TOLMAN, in Lynn, Essex co., MA^[7,49,151,156].

His wife Rest releases dower."^[152]

Nathaniel's will was written 22 September 1730 and proved in Boston, Suffolk co., MA on 24 Jan 1731. His son James received £60. His son and sole executor John received all the rest of his estate, conditionally that he pay 20s. apiece to his grandchildren Eleazer & Nathaniel Newhall and Nathaniel & Samuel Woodward. No other children are mentioned^[152].

Nathaniel married **Rest [surname not known]**. But Torrey says she is possibly a relative of Nathaniel Handford.

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452. Allen⁸ NEWHALL, Jr. (Allen⁷, Hanson⁶, Joseph⁵, Samuel⁴, Thomas³⁻², not known¹) On 15 June 1815 Allen married **Martha ADAMS**, in Lynn, Essex co., MA^[233].

464. Michal⁸ NEWHALL (Jedidiah⁷, Joseph⁶⁻⁴, Thomas³⁻², not known¹) was born on 16 January 1777 in Lynn, Essex co., MA^[49,266]. Michal died in Fremont, Rockingham co., NH on 12 January 1827; she was 49. Her name is also spelled Michel, Michael, Michah and Michail on occasion and birth records^[267]. On her son Oliver's Death Record, her name is given as "Michel Brown" ^[268] - clearly mixing up Michal Newhall and Allen's second wife Betsey Brown in a rather interesting combination. She is Waters #728.

On 7 February 1793 when Michal was 16, she married Allen NEWHALL^[265], son of Hanson NEWHALL & Hepzibah BREED, in Lynn, Essex co., MA^[210,233]. They lived on Market Street in Lynn until they moved to Fremont, New Hampshire. They were in New Hampshire by 11 October 1818, which is the date of Michal's letter home.

Two letters from Michal Newhall are extant and in the possession of Alan M. Hall of Orr's Island, ME. A transcription follows:

Epping [, New Hampshire] October the 11th 1818

Dear Children

It Seems(?) to be for long Since i Saw you I must rite a few lines although attended with a litel(?) expense thiese lines(?) leaves our famely well. But my head akes – so bad I have been a bed almost all day. I am very much afflicted with it Ever since I went to Lynn(?) likewise rumitisaism(?) But my appetite is good I due any work. Lydia has been done work for me 5 weeks She has kiepit(?) haus too George lives a mile above mr Hoyets they have got som New ourneture [furniture?] Lydia has been finding a Hundred pare of shoes for mr Mathwes T & G [Timothy? or Thomas? and George] has been making them

I could get along very well at present if I could due my washin without getting Sick. I have heard 2 days for two week after I came from Lynn I was a(?)moust crasey(?) with the Headake and other Complants & had my work to due at the same tim I did not dare to tell any one just how I felt But thought I should be crasey if my bad feelings continued for I felt somewhat agatated in mind about ma[n]y thing Sometimes I ame like many of old encombered with my tarering(?) and trubeled about many things of a worldly nature if I could live a litel free(?) from Care I could enjoy more health I hope Timothy will come to Lynn but wee can have work for my Gredely(?) som time but no good place to work in winter. Due rite to T [Timothy?] before long if he dont come I want Thams [Thomas?] two if he due enough for you or others to pay for Sculing a evings or his board this winter I hope others will come if Martha dount mr Newhall will come down at thanksgiving mr N & I expect to goe a journey next week to New Salam and Sand[wich] & Chester [all towns in New Hampshire] I have been to portsmouth [New Hampshire] & to exetor [Exeter, NH] of late. But two but litel Profit it is tranform work I got cotten for any beastick and some nese...s things the last time I expect to goe to market from this place.

I often think I could take much comfort in Lynn if I lived thier with my friends my Children and acquaintances But if it never is my lot again may I be contented in my destination. But if I can live in some Christian land whare the peopel is moralized and think of living for another would it will be very pleasing to mr Newhall and me. I have had some very agreabel hours as will as dull ones Since i was at Lynn, the quarterly Meeting was very good mr. othemion(?) preaches hear once a month & is a verry correct good speaker the peopel Flaock to geather but not all to hear the work for they dont lik to Set still On any acount I often think I should like to stay in the country but on others I cant baer the thought. mr Nichels I want you to Inquir the Price of Land in the new raod that leeds from John M to Breeds and on some of Joel Breeds if you need not let peopel know your end of enquiaring if old mr with[...?...] should be to tell at any time rite about it. Mr New/ thinks a litel of coming of a place should present that he likes with some land or he could build I think we must look all round and try to accomidate us in our old age if wee can but part of what wee now have But I will no dwell on this

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them any longer It Pestors my Brains. I wish I could gave(?) it upon(?) wee must commit our care to hyer Pwers and trust in a all wise God to direct in temporals as well as in Spiritual things
