The O'Connor, Sligo, was a principal family of Ireland at the end of the 17th century. In fact, they were a principal family of Ireland from the English Invasion until the end of the reign of King Henry the VIII in Connaught (Keenaught). American variations on the name include: Connor, Connors, O'Connell, O'Conner, O'Conners & O'Connors.

This Irish branch clearly came from Ireland to America as a result of the Potato Famine in the mid-1800s. Both Michael and his brother Felix, either by a lack of education or because of virulent anti-Irish predjudice, remained in "blue collar jobs" for their entire working careers. One thing that is clear is how hard the family tried to hide its Irish roots in the less than favorable climate towards the Irish that existed in the Boston area from 1840 on. Very soon, the family started referring to itself as "Connors" or "Connor" instead of the true family surname of "O'Connor". It wasn't until Lena's death in the 1950s that the true surname started appearing on vital records once again. Even in the 20th century, the family was not fully accepted because of its Irish roots instead of "proper old New England" ones. Luckily, the predjudice of having Irish ancestors has finally disappeared. It's about time.

2. Michael² O'CONNOR (*Michael*¹) was born on 21 May 1841 in co. Sligo, Ireland^[1,2,3]. This is verified by his daughter Lena's Birth Record & Michael's own Citizenship Papers Also, Michael was age 36 at the time of his second marriage in 1878. His lifelong occupation was as a Currier^[1,2,3].

Michael sailed from Liverpool, England to Boston, Suffolk co., MA on the S. S. "Sea King" - arriving on 27 October 1858. He is listed as "Michael O' Connell" and is 16 years of age.³

Michael's intention to be an American citizen was declared on 15 October 1866 and he was naturalized on 24 April 1867 at the age of 26. His brother Felix of Winchester and Peter Meehan of Woburn vouched for him^[3,6].

Michael and Margaret lived in Winchester through 1865 - Michael was age 22 and Margaret age 19. He was in Woburn when he applied for citizenship. These papers also indicated that he had lived in Stoneham^[3]. They lived in Woburn, Middlessex co., MA at the time of Margaret's death in 1873^[7].

The 1865 Winchester Census lists:

Michael first married **Margaret McCARTHY**, daughter of Thomas McCARTHY & Margaret [surname not known]. She was born on 7 August 1847 in Ireland^[2,7]. Her birthplace is verified by Lena's birth record. Margaret died of Cholera Morbus in Woburn, Middlesex co., MA on 9 September 1873; she was 26y. 1m. 2d^[7]. Her obituary was published in the 20 September 1873 edition of the *Woburn Journal*.

Her name is listed as "Maggie" on Lena and Mark R.'s Marriage Record⁵. Margaret's surname is given as "Connors" on her death record; yet her husband Michael's surname is given as O'Connor" on the very same record^[7].

On 3 March 1878 when Michael was 36, he second married **Margaret McDONALD**, daughter of Alexander McDONALD & Flora [surname not known] of Burlington, Middlesex co., MA, in Woburn, Middlesex co., MA^[1] by The Reverend James A. Gleason. She was born in 1843 in Nova Scotia, Canada^[1].

3. Felix O'CONNOR (*Michael*¹) was born on 29 September 1832 in co. Sligo, Ireland^[8]. Felix was a Laborer and later a Currier and was a witness for Michael on his citizenship papers. He was still living in Winchester, Middlesex co., MA in 1870 and through the turn of the century.

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Felix arrived in Boston 12 December 1852^[8] and declared his intention to become a citizen on 31 August 1854^[8] and was admitted as a citizen on 24 October 1864. Ironically, Peleg Sprague (see the Sprague familiy information) was one of the judges who heard his case^[9,10].

Felix married Ellen [surname not known].

4. Alina / Aleen "Lena" O'CONNOR (*Michael*²⁻¹) was born on 2 August 1865 in Winchester, Middlesex co., MA^[2,5,11] as "Alina O'Connor". Lena died in Lynn, Essex co., MA on 6 January 1959; she was 93y 5m 4d^[12,13]. She is buried in Pine Grove Cemetary, Lynn, Essex co., MA^[12]. The cause of her death was given as: Lobar Pneumonia (7 days), due to Arteriosclerosis (10 years), due to Senility (5 years)^[12].

Lena's birth name was Alina (in the Winchester VRs) or Aleena (in the Woburn VRs). At the time of her marriage, she gave her name as "Connor[s]". Lena lied about her age on her marriage certificate in 1884. She claimed an age of 21, but has a Birth Record of 1865. Her husband Mark Maddison also lied about his age, but to try to make himself appear to be younger than he was. On her son, Arthur's marriage certificate, her name was still given as Lena K. Connors^[11]. But, by the time of her death, her maiden name was once again given as the true "O'Connor".

Lena was of Woburn at the time of their marriage^[5]. It appears that Lena & Mark met while Mark and her father Michael were working together as Curriers. Mark was also a immigrant, from Nova Scotia, Canada, although his family seems to be of English origin.

On 19 April 1884 when Alina / Aleen "Lena" was 18, she married **Mark R. MADDISON**^[11], son of Mark MADDISON & Martha [surname not known], in Woburn, Middlesex co., MA^[5,14] by The Reverend Leander Thompson.
