1. Thomas¹ SOUTH. We currently know nothing of this couple, save their child, Ann. Based upon her 1602 birth year, and assuming that she is the first child of a first marriage, they were probably born circa 1580.

2. Ann² SOUTH (*Thomas¹*) was born in 1602, as estimated from a 1682 deposition, and died before 1689, which was the date of her will's record; she was 87^[1]. Ann's will was written in 1675 and recorded 9m(November):1689^[2,3]. Circa 1632 when Ann was 30, she first married **William IVORY**^[4], son of **William IVORY**, in Lynn, Essex co., MA^[5,6,7,8,9,10,11,12,13,14,15,16,17,18].
