Surname variations include de Styuecle, Stucle, Stucley, Stuckley and Stukeley.

First Generation

1. **Geoffrey¹ DE STYUECLE^[1]** was the Kings Esquire of Buckinghamshire, London and Ireland^[1]. He was known to be alive during 1349-1380, but we do not know his birth and death years. We know nothing of his wife.

2. **Richard² STUCKLEY, gent.** (*Geoffrey¹*) died in Trent, co. Somerset, England^[1]. Richard was the King's Esquire of Ridgewell, Essex, England and Escheator of the shires of Somerset & Dorset, England in 1412-1413^[2].

Richard was from Trent, Somerset, England^[1]. In 1410, he and his wife Elizabeth made a settlement on the manors of Great Glen in Leicestershire, England and Merston in Sussex, England^[1]. In 1425, they were living in the Merston manor in Sussex and in 1428 he was listed as holding the manor of Glen Magna, Leicester, England^[3].

Shortly before 2 December 1396 Richard married **Elizabeth FITZ ROGER**^[4,5,6,7,8,9,10,11,12,13,14,15,16], daughter of **Lord John FITZ ROGER & Alice**^[2].

3. **Hugh³ STUCKLEY**^[17,18,19,20,21,22,23,24,25,26] (*Richard², Geoffrey¹*) was probably born after 1400, as he was a younger son of Richard and Elizabeth^[17] and died before 13 December 1457 when his estate was administered^[17,23].

His descendants included his mother's Fitz Roger arms of Gules, Three Lions Rampant Or^[23] amongst the family's heraldic quarterings. He was Sheriff of Devonshire, England in 1448-9^[17,23]. Hugh held -- via the right of his wife -- the manors of Affeton, East & West Wolrington, Bradford Tracy, Brigerule, Meshaw and Thelbridge, all in Devonshire, England^[17]. Hugh's estate was administered on 13 December 1457^[17,23].

Before 19 December 1437 when Hugh was 39, he married **Katherine DE AFFETON**, daughter of **John DE AFFETON & Joan BRATTON**^[17,23].

4. Nicholas⁴ STUCKLEY^[28,29,30,31,32] (*Hugh³, Richard², Geoffrey¹*) was born circa 1451, as estimated from the fact that he was 16 years old in 1467^[33] and died on 27 May 1488; he was 37^[33].

Nicholas was the son & heir of his father, Hugh^[28,33]. He was the lord (with a small "L") of the manors of Affeton, East & West Wolrington, Bradford Tracy, Huntshaw, and Meshaw -- all in Devonshire, England; Trent & Chilton Cantelowe -- both in Somerset, England; as well as Preston, Halfhyde & St. Mary Blanford -- in Dorset, England^[28,33].

Nicholas was mentioned in the *Inquisition post mortem* of Thomas Stukeley on 17 Edward IV (1477/8). [*Chancery File 63 (49)*]. Given the dates, I believe that Thomas was a brother or cousin of Nicholas.

Before 24 June 1475 when Nicholas was 24, he first married **Thomasine COCKWORTHY**^[28], daughter of **John COCKWORTHY & Thomasine CHICHESTER**^[33].

Circa 1479 when Nicholas was 28, he second married **Anne POMEROY**^[28], daughter of **Henry POMEROY & Alice RALEIGH**^[28].

5. Sir Thomas⁵ STUCKLEY, Knt.^[34,35,36,37] (*Nicholas⁴, Hugh³, Richard², Geoffrey¹*) was born on 24 June 1475 in Affeton, parish of West Wolrington, Devonshire, England^[34], as estimated from the fact that he was aged 4 at his mother's *Inquisition post mortem* [*Henry VII, I:558-560*]. Thomas died in Affeton on 30 January 1541/2; he was 65^[34].

Thomas was the son and heir of his father, Nicholas^[34]. He held manors of Affeton, East and West Wolrington (both with advowsons), Mewshaw (with advowson), Bridgerule, Drayford, Huntshaw, Thelbridge (with advowson), Studlegh, Bradford Tracy, and Pyllaven. All were located in Devonshire, England. Thomas was a Knight and Sheriff of Devonshire, England in 1520-1521^[34].

The *Inquisition post mortem* for Thomas Stuckley, Knt. was held on 34 Henry VIII (1542)^[34].

Thomas married **Anne WOOD**^[34,35,37], daughter of **Sir Thomas WOOD & Margaret DE LA MARE [LENHAM]**.
