An upbeat bass line, a string section, and Ray LaMontagne's own sandpaper-grit vocals all adorn the title track from his 2004 debut album, *Trouble*, but the tune's bobbing 6/8 rhythm is powered throughout by a clean six-string acoustic guitar. The song's chord vocabulary is fairly straightforward, with the possible exception of the A9sus2 chords in the first and third

lines of the post-chorus section. These chords are filled out by the bass on the original recording, so if they sound a little thin for solo guitar, try mimicking the bass part as shown in the example below.

To help maintain the song's momentum, LaMontagne favors strumming chord suspensions, which often occur at the end of his vocal lines (particularly the ones that end on D chords). To keep things simple, I've left most of these flourishes out of the transcription below, but feel free to include them in your own rendition using the Dsus2 and Dsus4 chords shown here.
