## **Losing My Religion**

"Before 'Losing My Religion,' R.E.M. was a large cult band touring ten months a year. Afterward, we were one of the biggest bands in the world," wrote Peter Buck in the liner notes for *In Time: The Best of R.E.M. 1993–2003*. Songs that have such an impact often write themselves. The music for "Losing My Religion" was written in five minutes, and Michael Stipe produced lyrics within the hour. "To me, 'Losing My Religion' feels like some kind of archetype

floating around in space that we managed to lasso. If only all songwriting was this easy," Buck wrote.

In this version, the guitar part is shown in chord diagrams above the notation. The riffs and lead lines played by the mandolin have been adapted for guitar. Play the parts as written and the notes will sound an octave lower than on the recording. To more closely emulate the mandolin, pick up a guitar with a cutaway, strap a capo on the 12th fret, and the lead lines will be in the same range as the mandolin parts on the recording. The added open E string helps emulate the double-stops played by stereo mandolin parts, occasionally mimicking the double-course sound of a mandolin with unison double-stops played at the fifth fret of the B string and the open E string.
