## Ripple

"Ripple" appeared on the Grateful Dead's sixth release American Beauty. Penned by Jerry Garcia and Robert Hunter, the song pairs Hunter's philosophical musings with Garcia's laid-back, rootsy grooves.

On the recording, one guitar kicks things off with a riff in the left channel; this part is played in the key of G in root posi-

tion. Throughout the course of the song, another guitar plays in the right channel,

with a capo on the seventh fret. Both parts play embellishments for each chord shape, but we've represented the basic shapes for each one below, so you can play the song in two places. This comes in handy at jams: When everyone else plays the song in G down at the nut, try playing along in C with a capo on the seventh fret, and you'll add something different to the mix. Over the lyrics, the bottom set of chords refers to shapes played in root position. The chords above (in parentheses) refer to chords played with a capo on the seventh fret. Try the alternate-bass strumming pattern below for either part.
